We have had an excellent start to the new school year in Dragon Class. We have been discussing Growth Mindset and how it can help us with our learning. We have already started looking at place value in Maths and have completed some tricky challenges.

We have had a brilliant start to the new school year. Getting used to new surroundings and new people can sometimes be a real challenge, however, we have spent a long time talking about what we need to do to help each other with our learning and promote a happy and healthy learning environment. Centaurs are all looking forward to the coming academic year.

Phoenix News

We have had a great few days in Phoenix class. All of the children have come into school with a positive attitude and ready for the challenges of Year 4. In maths we have been working really hard on knowing Roman Numerals up to 100. We have been looking at fables in English and begun our new topic 'The Americas'.

<u>Shillington Lower School Parents Survey June 2018 Summary</u>

We had responses covering 77 children which is a good response and more than double the number last year! The overall results are very positive. I am firstly delighted at the number of responses and the amount of time and effort that parents went to in writing comments. I will make sure that positive comments that specifically refer to individuals are passed on to them. I will also make sure that we address where possible as many concerns that you have. I am always available to listen to your comments and I warmly welcome them all. I take the viewpoint that we can always improve!

Highlights

Everyone agreed that they are confident in the school's future – with the percentage strongly agreeing (74%) being the highest in the last 10 years by some margin.

The Management categories were again strong, 100% agreed, 60% strongly agreed that the school is well managed; parents also thought the school is well resourced in terms of staff (95% agreed)

Staff encourage my child to be independent and confident; the school provides adequate access (physical and otherwise) for its disabled users; the school has good links with the community; and the two questions relating to the PTFA, all showed overwhelming agreement

Children enjoy coming to school (95% agreed) and feel safe and well cared for (96%)

Everyone agreed that children are encouraged to be independent and confident, the school values all children, and the school is welcoming.

Parents overwhelmingly thought it was beneficial to have the pre-school as part of the school and the before and after school club on the school site

Possible areas for review and improvement

Communication – the new question 'the school communicates with me effectively about how to support my child's learning only had 36% in strong agreement, although 93% overall agreed. We have already made changes to the information we give parents about how well your children are doing. What we need to do now is be able to give parents a way of helping you support your children more effectively. We fully appreciate that finding time to attend open mornings and afternoons in school time, excludes working parents and so we are planning to develop our use of a free App called Seesaw and there will be more information about this coming out to you soon.

Extra curricular – only 43% strongly agreed although 94% overall agree, that the school offers a good range of activities that enhance learning. The range of activities offered within school time is very wide but we will look at ways of offering more clubs outside of school time. I would be interested to know what parents have a desire to see offered. Is it clubs that carry a cost, offered by other providers or is it no cost afterschool activities that parents are seeking?

We are looking at reintroducing a Parents' Forum. This may be something that we can discuss through this Forum.

Shillington Lower School PTFA Newsletter (Parents, Teachers, Friends Association)

As a parent you are a welcome member of the PTFA and are automatically considered a member as soon as you become part of the school. Being a member, you can do as little or as much as you want. You are welcome to come along to any of the PTFA meetings, you are not obliged to attend every meeting, and you are not committed to roles at every event.

To make the PTFA work, we are reliant on good will and volunteers.

We communicate via Parentmail, Shillington Lower School PTFA Facebook page and Shillington Mums Facebook page.

The group's purpose is to bring the community together, create fun events for both kids and parents, and work closely with the school to enhance our children's experience whilst at Shillington School. The funds we raise are all fed back into the school for the benefit of our children.

Annually we fund the maintenance and upkeep of the swimming pool, this costs in the region of £2,000. We are very fortunate to have this facility and the kids have regular use of this all over the summer, we also use the pool for out of school activities such as the recent camping event.

Each year we give a donation to each class for their school trips of around £200 per class and fund the Year 4 leavers presents and Young Voices trip.

We provide fruit, refreshments and ice lollies for Sports Day.

We do an Easter egg hunt and give every child an egg.

We serve Christmas dinner to the children and provide each child with a chocolate.

We also fund bigger projects or equipment that the school need over and above their curriculum or budget.

We have successfully replaced the flooring and all the tables in the field under the canopy; this was funded by a grant from Shillington Parish Council alongside £2,800 from the PTFA.

We hold a summer camping/fun day event, Christmas Fayre, ice-lolly and cake sales to name a few. We hope to be able to do more with new support, i.e. a summer ball?

We have a core team of people that meet regularly to plan events/fundraisers and liaise and coordinate directly with the school.

We have a rep for each year. Their role is a point of contact, to help communicate and get volunteers, attend meetings when they can and to help plan what the PTFA does.


