Dear Parents

Our values are very important in our schools. I ask the whole of our community to share our school values and to live them both inside and outside of school. Friendship and respect are arguably two of the most important and the ones that we are focusing on this month. With this in mind, I urge parents to remember and always follow these messages. Some of our children have very serious and potentially life threatening allergies to nut. We ask parents not to send items in packed lunches that contain nuts. We do this to minimize the risk for these pupils of coming into contact with nut products either through ingesting them or physical contact/touch. This includes when children are out on school trips and sports events.

I also need to ask parents to be considerate when parking locally at drop off and pick up time. We have had messages from local residents this week about this. I understand how frustrating it must be for local people and I also understand how difficult parking around schools is for everybody concerned. I don't think there is a school which does not have this as an issue for them. The only way to tackle this is for everybody to just show some consideration and understanding. If you are able, then walking regularly and making this a regular habit is healthy and better for everybody as well as the environment.

Finally, I have also been made aware that some children are going to the toilet in the car park and park after school. We have also had a complaint about that from a member of the public. We do our best to ensure that children use the toilet before they leave school as part of the getting ready for home time routine. But children do sometimes get distracted and forget. In an emergency we will absolutely let children back into school to use the toilet before they leave so if you are planning an extended park visit after school, perhaps ask your child just to pop back into school to go to the toilet rather than let them go in the car park or play park for all sorts of safety, hygiene and safeguarding reasons.

Thank you to everybody for their respect and understanding.


