A reminder for a peaceful and safe Bonfire night—Always follow the firework code

- Stand well back
- •Keep pets indoors
- •Keep fireworks in a closed box
- •Only buy fireworks that are CE marked
- •Light at arm's length, using a taper
- •Follow the instructions on each firework
- •Never give sparklers to a child under five
- •Don't drink alcohol if setting off fireworks
- •Always supervise children around fireworks
- •Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves
- Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them
- •Never go near a firework that has been lit even if it hasn't gone off it could still explode
