Value of Honesty

Our current value is honesty. This can be defined as:

Phonics Screening Check

This takes place for Year 1 children and some Year 2 pupils next week. It is therefore essential that children are in school for this national test. The children have been working hard on their phonics and reading both real and fake words. The check will be done on a one-to-one basis with the class teacher. The children are very familiar with the format of the test and should not be unduly fazed by it. Please remember this is a test of their phonic ability and approach to reading words not about their understanding. Our parent information sessions earlier in the year outlined the content and approach of these checks.

Walk to School Week

Next week Shillington Lower will be holding its Walk to School Week. This was a great success last year. We would like to encourage as many children as possible to walk, scoot or cycle to school. This will not only be a healthier option but also an eco-friendly one that can support our efforts to gain the Green Flag award for which our assessment is imminent! If a car is an essential part of your journey, why not 'Park and Stride' by leaving your car in the village hall car park and walking to school? Each day we will be completing a survey to record our means of travel.

Swimming Pool News

Our swimming pool is now up and running! Swimming kit and towel should be in school every day as we seize the opportunity to use the pool whenever we can (dependent on water and air temperature). The pool is clearly an enticing feature for the village and it has come to our attention from much discussion on social media that some upper school pupils have been climbing gates/fences to gain access to the pool. At this point the school roof has been damaged. If you are aware that such a criminal act is being carried out (eg. trespassing on school property, vandalism ...) can we ask that you report it directly to the police at that time? Much fundraising, time and effort has been put into maintaining the pool for use by the children at the lower school and if the pool is vandalised it will be taken out of action and the children will be unable to enjoy this wonderful facility. We appreciate your support in this matter.

Pre-School Pixie Class

We understand that some parents have questioned why the school is only offering morning sessions initially when the new pre-school Pixie class comes to fruition in September. The Governing Board does aim to provide 30 hours of pre-school provision in Pixie Class. However, in setting up Pixie Class the governors took the decision, following advice from Central Bedfordshire Council Early Years Team, to offer morning only sessions in the first instance while we build up a customer base. We cannot run at a loss to the detriment of the school so are unable to open for full days unless we know we have sufficient numbers of children to break even. We are hoping to build up pupil numbers quickly and therefore offer full days as soon as we can to enable parents to take up their 30 hours of free childcare, where eligible, at Shillington Lower School.
