Attendance

The school is currently working with the other local schools to finalise our new attendance policy. Once complete this document will be made available to all parents/carers. Regular attendance is a major contributory factor to successful outcomes and therefore regular attendance is strongly encouraged. Our school target for attendance is 96%. For the first half term, class attendance was as follows:

Year 3 96 % Year 4 97%

Overall attendance 97 %

Within these statistics there are children whose attendance has already fallen below 90%. The school will be in contact with these families. Please be reminded that holidays in term time are not permitted. Should your child suffer repeatedly with periods of illness, the school nursing team will be called upon for support to encourage more regular attendance.

Governing Board

Our Governing Board have been busy this term continuing to oversee the strategic direction of the school and providing a challenging and supporting role.

As parents are now very well aware, they have been most particularly working on investigating and then moving towards the collaboration with Stondon. It was very good to have several of the Stondon Governors as well as nearly all of our Governors represented at the very positive meetings with parents on Wednesday night where our incoming Headteacher, Sarah Woodham, was able to talk to and with parents about January's new set-up and looking on to a very special future.

Governors have also been putting in a great deal of work and wisdom to help create our wonderful new preschool – Pixie class.

In addition to the programme of meetings, we are also lucky to see various members of the governing body in and around school on a regular basis including formal meetings to review a variety of key aspects of how the school is working to deliver the best provision for our children. It is a great governance team and the school is lucky to be able to draw on this great source of support.
