### **Parents Phonics Workshop**

Many thanks to those parents who were able to attend the phonics coffee morning this week. It was an opportunity to find out about how we teach phonics and an insight into how your child learns to read at school. Parents were introduced to learning the letter sounds and then how we teach the children to blend sounds to read words. Most UK schools follow a synthetic phonics programme which teach children to pronounce letters using pure sounds. We follow the Letters and Sounds publication.

Terminology:

A phoneme is a speech sound

A grapheme is a written representation of one sound

Segmenting is breaking words into sounds

Blending is the joining of sounds together to read words.

We also teach 'tricky words'; words which do not follow phonic patterns, 'high frequency' words; common words that appear often in written texts and 'alien' words; words that make no sense but encourage children to use their phonological knowledge.

The phonics screening test takes place in June of year 1, those not meeting the required pass level will retake the test in year 2. The words in the test are a mixture of real and alien words and the children are required to sound them out and blend them correctly.

To help your children at home the most important thing to do is read every night with them. Learn to say the sounds yourself, practice blending them, talk about spelling rules and check that what has been read makes sense.
