We've had a very active week this week in Dragon class! As part of our English work we went on a long and interesting walk around Shillington. This week in Centaurs we have been busy measuring in metres and centimetres. We went on a hunt around the classroom trying to find objects that were between different lengths e.g. between 1m and 1m 50cm. We then had a go at measuring each other's arm span. The longest arm span in our class was 1m 35cm!

In Literacy we continued looking at the story of 'Leon and the Place Between.' The children created really powerful noun phrases to describe the magical setting and discussed how Leon might be feeling at different points in the story.

We are looking forward to finding out about the lives of people who lived in the Stone Age and the children generated lots of questions they would like to find out the answers to.

This week we have been writing descriptions of the Antarctic and then comparing it to Shillington—we found out lots of geographical facts.
